■ You Must Complete the Procedure for Returning Medical Expenses after Losing Eligibility for Ota City's National Health Insurance Program

If you used your insurance card for the Ota City National Health Insurance program to visit a medical institution after you lost eligibility for the program because you moved out of Ota City, joined health insurance program of a company or other types of programs, ended your period of stay in Japan, or for any other reason, you must return the portion of your medical expenses that were paid for by Ota City.

If you have joined health insurance program of a company or other types of programs, or moved out of Ota City, be sure to notify Ota City that you will leave its National Health Insurance program and return the insurance card that was issued to you.

■ Enrolling in the National Pension System

All people between the ages of 20 and 59 who have registered as residents in Japan—including non-Japanese residents—must join the National Pension System and pay its premiums. Paying your premiums for more than ten years will make you eligible to receive the National Pension when you reach the age of 65.

The system also includes a “disability pension” that is paid when you are unable to work due to injury or illness, and a “survivor’s pension” that is paid when a family member who had been working to support you dies. You must complete the National Pension enrollment procedure when you first arrive in Japan or leave your employer.

Please apply for an exemption if you have difficulty paying the National Pension system premiums.
